Rediscovering Prayer: The day that prayer began

Praying has always been hard for Christians. I once heard John Stott say that it was his greatest struggle in the Christian life. I suspect that most Christians today would add a heartfelt Amen to that! I know I have never found prayer easy.

Add to that the fact that right now, at this point in history of the church of the Lord Jesus Christ, prayer is not front and centre. Let's take a fresh look at what the Bible actually says about prayer.

Where is the first in the Bible? You might have read over this in Genesis 4:25-26 : "And Adam knew his wife again, and she bore a son and called his name Seth, ... To Seth also a son was born, and he called his name Enosh. At that time people began to call upon the name of the Lord." This is the day that prayer began.

But why did people start to 'call on the name of Yahweh'? At first glance it isn't all that obvious. Not much happens in the verses, or the chapter leading up to this announcement. But there really can be only one reason – people start to pray because of the birth of Enosh.

Enosh doesn't get much airplay in the Old Testament – in fact you may never given him a second thought – but his birth triggers the start of prayer. Why? The answer is simple but important: it is because people begin to understand the gospel. For the first time, people start to get a glimpse of God's master plan that would ultimately lead to the coming of the Lord Jesus and change the whole universe.

'Where does it say that?' I hear you say. Step back to Gen.3:15, God promises Adam that one of Eve's children will stamp on the head of the serpent. Who is the most likely candidate? At the beginning of Ch.4 it Abel and Cain are the possibilities. But with Abel's death at the hand of Cain, both are ruled out. The next contender has to be Seth, but what are we told about Seth? Nothing, so it can't be him. By this stage people might be getting a little impatient.

This is when it starts to become evident that everything may not get sorted out straight away. It's at this point, it seems, that they realise that they are going to have to wait a while for God to fulfil His promises, and they start to "call on Yahweh". This is when they start to pray.

"To call on God" here surely means to cry to God to come through on his promises, to do what we cannot do for ourselves, and to admit our weaknesses and appeal to His awesome strength. They start to pray because they see both God's commitment to us, and their own helplessness. They pray because they know that God is for them, because He has said so, and they are weak, because He has said so. In other words, prayer starts with the gospel. It always has and always will.

Can we Achieve Our Vision?

Here we are with 2017 passing by at a rate of knots already. I want to thank all of you who have renewed your membership and made donations to CBMC. Having done that, what do you say CBMC is to someone who may ask you?

Do you mumble some words like those of our Mission Statement, or do you speak with confidence about the impact of the ministry? What I see by faith is not quite the reality around me. Let's rehearse some of the aspects of our faith and the integration in our daily lives so that we connect what our vision of the ministry is with practical elements incorporated under our Vision – 'To impact Australia by saturating the marketplace with the Gospel of Jesus'.

I beg you not to think this Vision for the CBMC ministry is too lofty for us to attain. There is an adage 'eat the elephant one mouthful at a time'. In fact the Bible gives us much more instruction and encouragement. It starts off by telling us that on our own we are destined to fail. But when we remain connected to Jesus, He will envision and empower us to help build His Kingdom. Paul has addressed this in this way: in Colossians 3:23 "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters." and to the Ephesians in Ch.2:10 "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

I have selected only one of many scriptures to look at what Jesus said:

"1. I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. 2 He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. 3 You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. 4 Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. 5 "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. 6 If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. 7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you." [John 15:1-7]

Ah! It seems that Prayer is crucial. How do we know if this activity (good though it may be) is actually what God is asking us to do? Answer: we need to pray. How do we remain connected to 'The Vine'?

Answer: we need to pray.

When we look at the Attributes of a Marketplace Ambassador, we see that they are not things we do in our own strength and wisdom. Their development and exercise are dependent upon us 'remaining connected to the vine.' Paul again instructs us (Rom.12:2) "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is – His good, pleasing, and perfect will." So we conclude that Bible reading and prayer work together to bring about our obedience - God's purposes, to help bring about God's Kingdom.

Prayer is powerful to bring down strongholds and the things that stand against God Almighty. Meeting together for prayer, encouragement, training, and accountability is the foundation of our CBMC ministry, so we honour Jesus all day, every day, not just at church.
